What else has been going on at the Business Centre?

Manufacturing Option

This is Gareth building our latest Toylander – a toy Land Rover which is one third real life size. This Series 1 model is powered by batteries and two electric motors and was built by trainees at the BBC. They constructed the body kit, steering and brake mechanisms, and electrics. Gareth said, "The experience has given me confidence to work through tasks by myself". A finished Toylander, built to BBC standards can sell for nearly £3000, so students are aware that quality is really important at every stage. They love the satisfaction of a finished product that's going to be appreciated in its new home. We think you'll agree that it's an impressive project.









Retail Option



Our Trainees assess donated books for quality, postage cost and potential sales price before listing them on Amazon. Since starting we've sold over 790 books and are currently having a boom as lockdown gave more people a chance to read.

Catering Option

We have had our catering operation open for just over two years. Gary comes from a military catering background and is used to feeding thousands! He has also owned businesses in the catering profession.

Over the past two years, the team at the BBC have been extremely busy catering for two weddings, the June show at the Worcestershire showground, weekly food for a local rugby club and a local tennis club where they have also produced food for top table functions.

They have also had members of the team out on work experience which included butchers, hotels and a family run bakery.
